# Annual Meeting - January 7, 2026

The Annual Meeting of the Rancho del Ciervo HOA will be held on Wednesday, January 7, 2026, in the media room at Community Covenant Church, 5070 Cathedral Oaks Road.

The meeting starts at 7:00 PM and ends around 8:30 PM. Refreshments will be served. Remote attendance is possible via the link <u>bit.ly/rdchoa\_meet</u>. (No special app necessary; it's a web page.)

We will be hosting two Guest Speakers from the Santa Barbara County Fire Safe Council at our meeting - Charlotte A. Zeamer, Education Program Manager and Kate Furlong, Community Resilience Program Manager. They will be leading a practical, homeowner-friendly talk on defensible space and home hardening—two of the most effective ways to reduce wildfire risk.

<u>Defensible space</u> focuses on how vegetation, landscaping, and outdoor items can affect your home's vulnerability to fire. <u>Home hardening</u> means making your house itself more resistant to embers, heat and flames through special retrofits and material choices, many of the most important ones being easy to do and inexpensive.

You'll learn what matters most in fire-smart maintenance practices and home retrofits, where to start, and how small actions can make a big difference. There will be a Q&A after the info session.

Owners will also vote in the Board election. Currently the Board has nine members. Seven have terms that run through 12/31/2026; two are up for re-election to two-year terms:

## Potential Insurance Discount

Several residents have obtained discounts on their property insurance as a result of our neighborhood being designated "FireWise". Some residents have reported discounts of up to 10% off their annual premium. Insurers known to give discounts are State Farm and the California Fair Plan. Other insurance companies may also offer discounts. Please contact your insurance agent to inquire. Insurers will need to see the FireWise certificate and the Fire Map, both of which are available from our website at ranchodelciervo.org/firewise.

It will only take 15 minutes (or less), and it is an essential component of following our 3-year plan and maintaining our FireWise status. In addition, it will help you identify hazards on your property. And it helps us keep our contact records up-to-date. The survey is confidential and used ONLY by the HOA. FireWise Chair, Grant Aaron, and President, Tanya Paye, kindly request that residents submit the survey by December 31, 2025. Residents that have not responded by this deadline will be added to our door-to-door in-person survey schedule.
